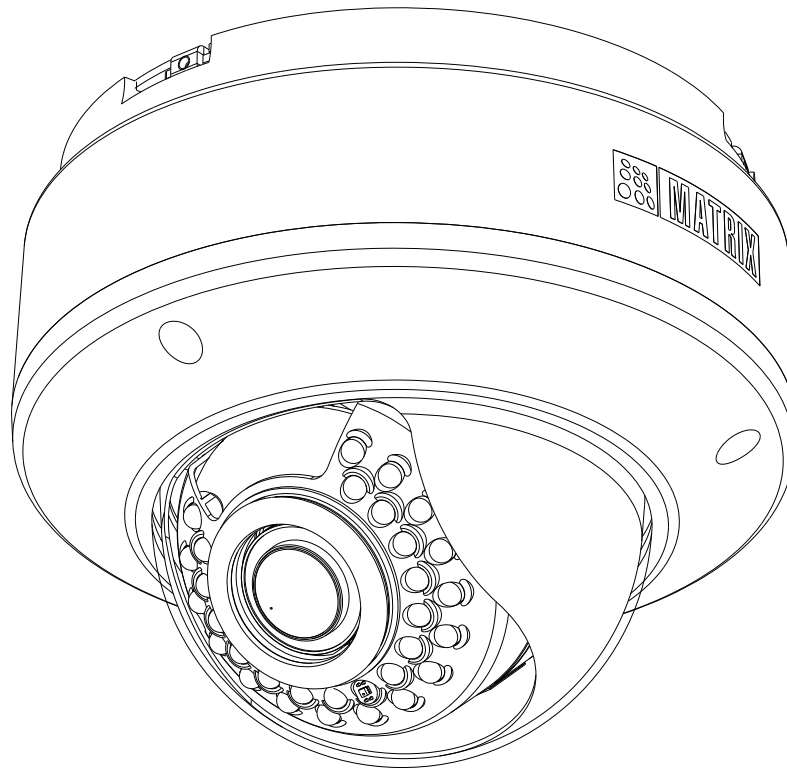

Safety Instructions

- Ensure that the power supply voltage is correct before using the camera.
- Avoid placing cables too close to magnetic or high voltage devices, to reduce undesirable image noise.
- Do not touch sensor modules with fingers. For cleaning use 'clean cloth' and wipe it gently.
- Do not mount the camera with the lens facing the sun or bright light to prevent damage to the sensor.
- Do not expose the camera to temperatures below or beyond its operating temperature.
- Do not mount the camera near a radiator or a heater.

Warning

- In the use of the product, you must be in strict compliance with the electrical safety regulations of the region and nation.
- Do not connect several devices to one power adapter as it may cause over-heating or fire hazard.
- If smoke, odour or noise rise from the device, turn off the power at once and unplug the power cable, and contact the nearest service center.
- To prevent electrical shock, turn off power supply before making electrical connections.

Know your Camera

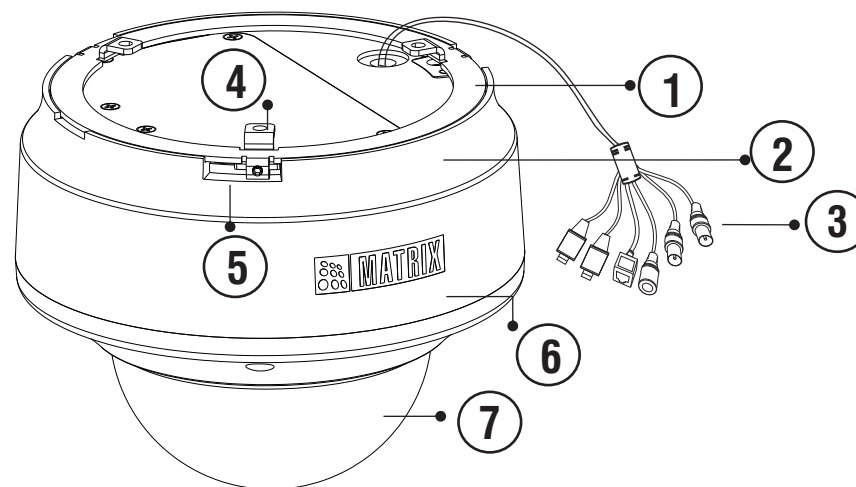

The **Standard** variant consists of 2 connectors: Power Connector and Ethernet Connector (POE).

The **Premium** variant consist of 6 connectors: Power Connector, Ethernet Connector (POE), Audio IN, Audio OUT, Alarm IN and Alarm OUT.

What your Package contains

- SATATYA Dome IP Camera Unit

Things you will Need

- A Power Drill, Screwdriver Set, Pliers, Wire-cutter, Ladder.
- Necessary Cabling
- A Power Supply with the recommended output voltage of 12V DC.
Use an adapter to connect the camera to the power outlet.

Camera Variants

The Bullet Cameras are available in following variants:

- 1. Standard** Variant used for General Surveillance in Discipline/Safety Precaution.
- 2. Premium** Variant used for Objective Surveillance in Entry/Exit Monitoring, Periphery Monitoring, Productivity Monitoring, Unethical Practices Monitoring.



You can capture near and broader view with lens of 2.8mm and 4.0 mm focal length. For example it can be used in ATM and Elevators.

With lens of 6 mm focal length, far and narrow view can be captured. For example it can be used in corridors or long passage to capture long view.

Installation Instruction

1. This product is intended to be supplied by a UL listed power supply unit marked “Class 2” or “LPS” or “PS2” and rated 12VDC, 2A min.

2. The wired LAN hub providing Power over the Ethernet (PoE) in accordance with IEEE 802-3af shall be a UL listed device with the output evaluated as a limited power source as defined in UL60950-1 or Ps2 as defined in UL62368-1.

Installation

Before you start:

Please make sure,

- The device in the package is in good condition and all the assembly parts are included.
- All the related equipments are powered-off before installation.
- The wall or ceiling is strong enough to support the weight of camera.

Step 1: Select a Location

Select a suitable location for your camera to enable coverage of the intended surveillance area. The location should preferably be a flat surface, such as a wall or a ceiling.

You can install the camera where cables are running through the interior of the wall or ceiling. Else cabling has to be done through POE.

Step 2: Prepare for Installation

Ensure that the necessary cabling to connect the camera to LAN port and Power outlet are in place. The connecting cables from the monitoring site should be ready at the installation site.

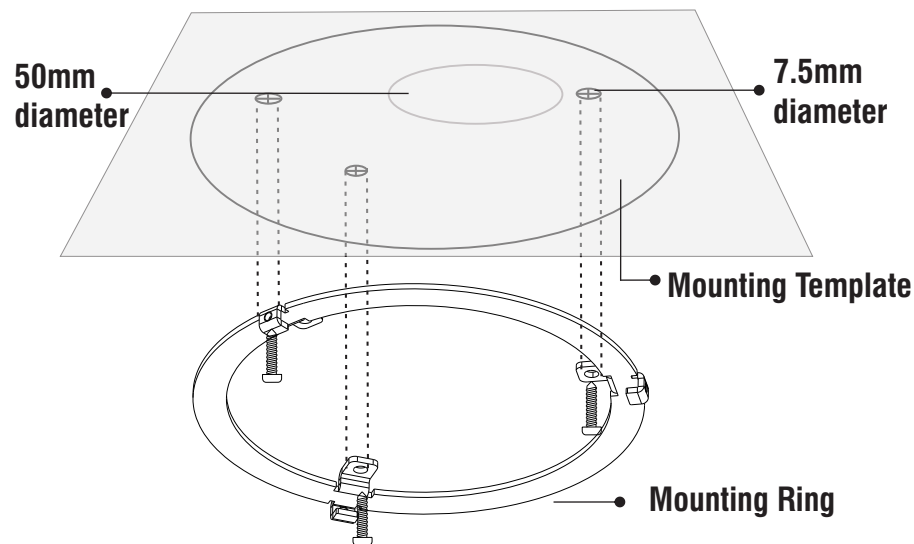
You can insert SD card in camera to store recordings during network failover and to upload image or clip as a result of event trigger.

See page **22** to view the SD card slot in camera.

Step 3: Installing Mounting Template

- Stick the Mounting Template on the desired installation surface.
- Drill three 7.5mm diameter holes through the markings of the Mounting Template on Wall or Ceiling. (Drill 50mm diameter hole also if installing on false ceiling)
- Insert the screw grips in the holes you drilled.

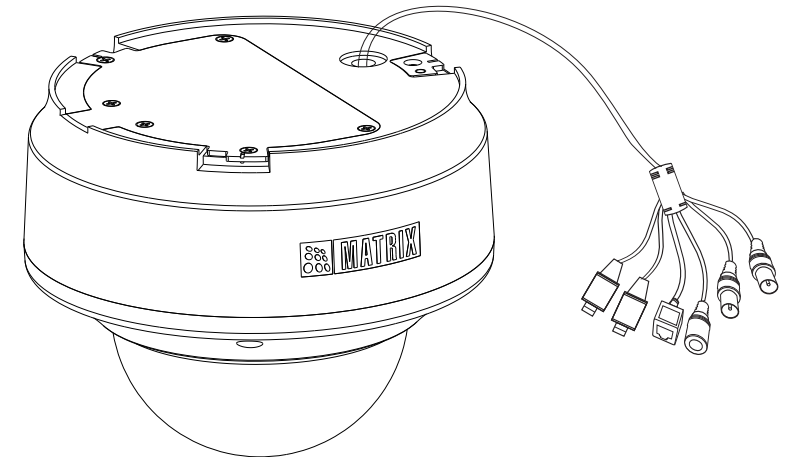
- Align the screw holes on the base plate with those you drilled on the installation surface.

Step 4: Mounting the Camera

A. On Wall/Ceiling

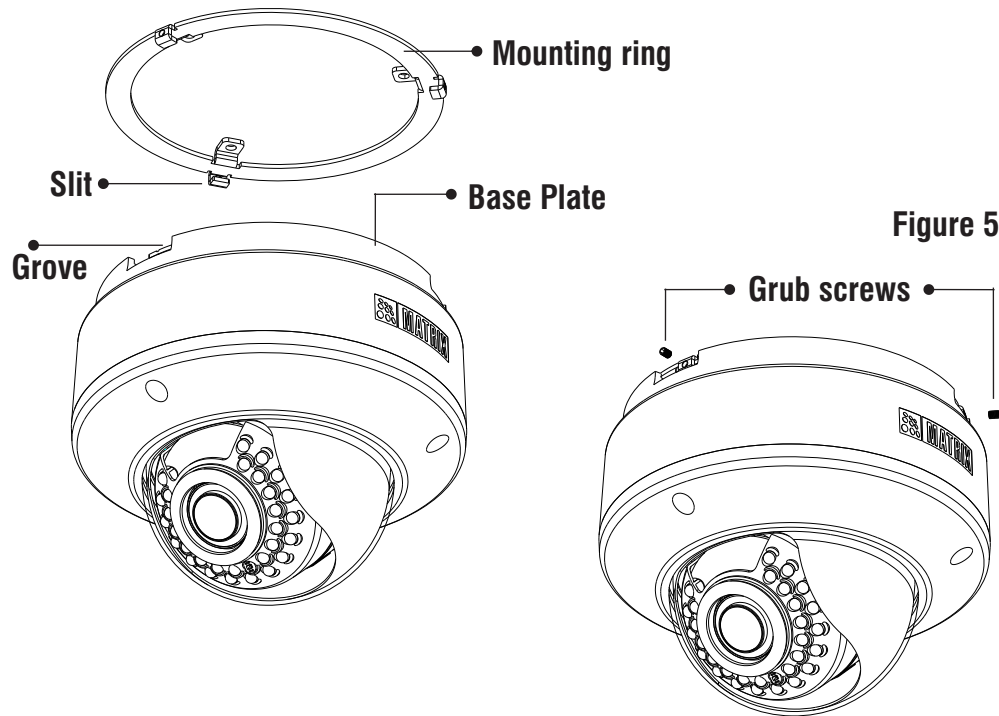
- To avoid cable damage, take the Power, Ethernet, Audio IN, Audio OUT, Alarm IN, Alarm OUT cables of the camera through the cable hole on the base plate, see **Figure 3**.
- If the cabling is concealed, prior to the installation pull the cable off the hole drilled on the installation surface.

- Now secure the base plate of the camera to the mounting ring. Interlock the mounting ring slit to the groove on the base plate, see **Figure 4**.
- Turn the camera body clockwise to fit in the slit of mounting ring.
- Finally fit the base plate with three M3x4 Grub screws, see **Figure 5**.

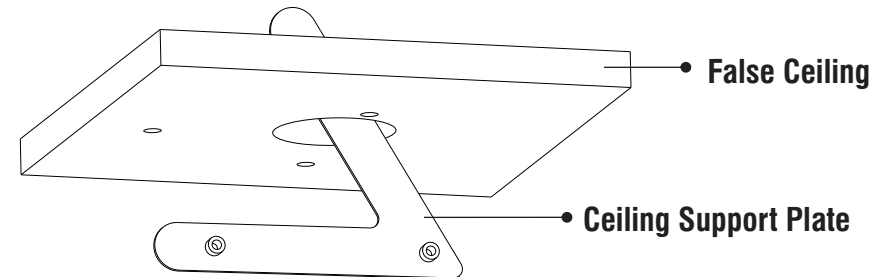
B. On False Ceiling (Recommended Method)

For installing Dome Camera on false ceiling follow the below mentioned steps,

- Install the mounting template on the false ceiling.
- Drill the holes through the markings of the mounting template on the false ceiling.
- By this you will get one 50mm diameter and three 7.5mm diameter holes on the false ceiling.

- Insert the Ceiling Support Plate through the 50mm diameter hole as shown in **Figure 6**.

- Place the Ceiling support plate over the false ceiling with keeping the clinching nuts towards the holes on mounting template.
- Move Ceiling Support Plate manually as the holes on Ceiling Support Plate align with the holes (7.5mm) on mounting template as illustrated in **Figure 7**.

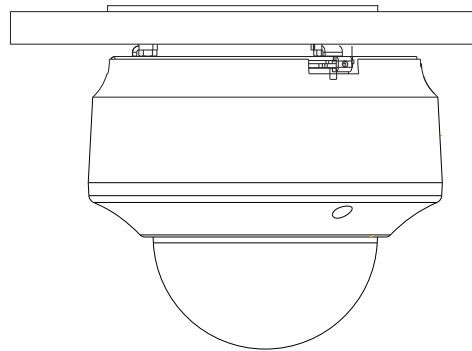

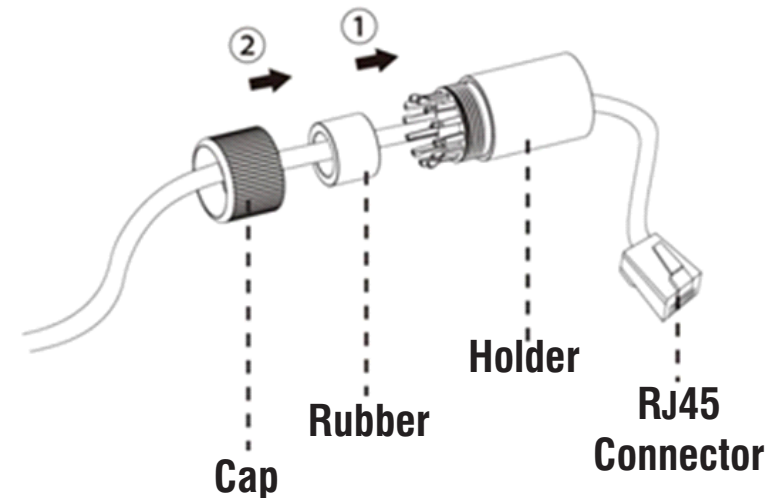
- Align the screw holes of the mounting ring with the holes (7.5mm) on mounting template and insert the screws through the false ceiling as illustrated in **Figure 8**.
- It is recommended to use M4 Pan-PH screws of length 35mm.
- Tighten the screws.
- Finally fix the Camera to the mounting ring as illustrated in **Figure 9**.

Step 3: Ingress Protection Accessory Installation

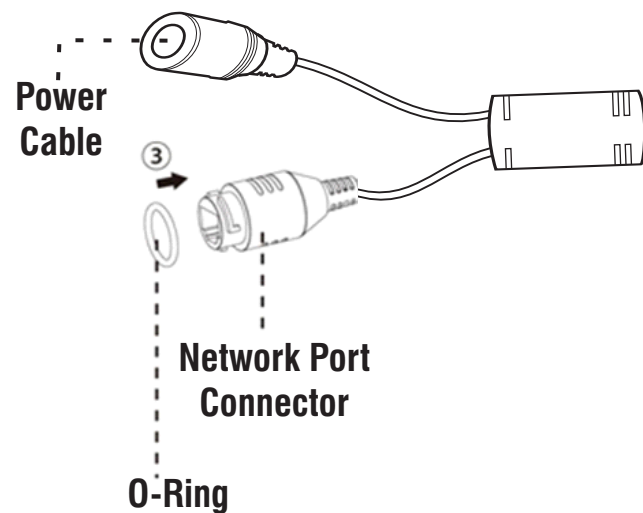
1. The Ingress Protection Accessory comprises of the following: Holder, Rubber, Cap and O-Ring.

You need to pass the RJ45 cable with connector through each in the sequence as shown below.

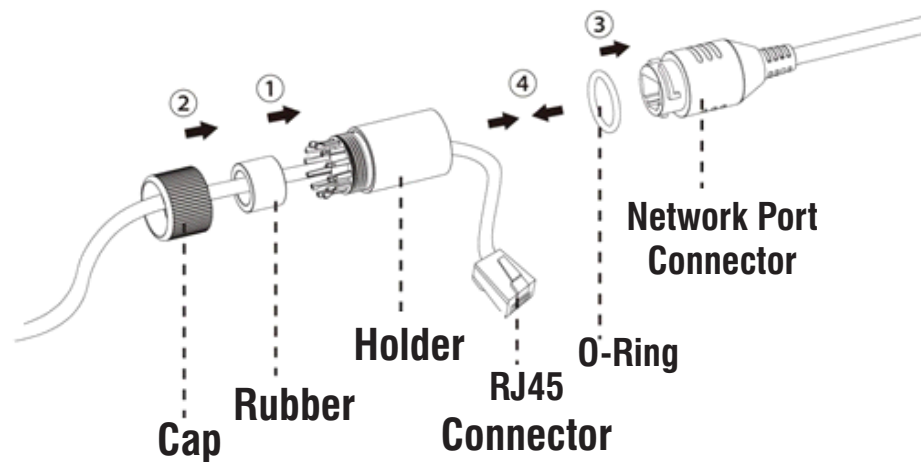
Now, insert the Rubber into the Holder and then place the Cap.



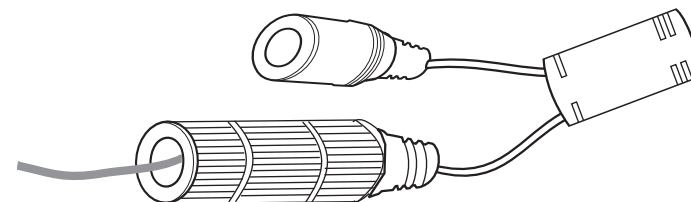
2. Affix the O-Ring on the Network Port Connector as shown below.



3. Insert RJ45 Connector into the Network Port Connector.



4. The Ingress Protection Accessory is connected with the camera.

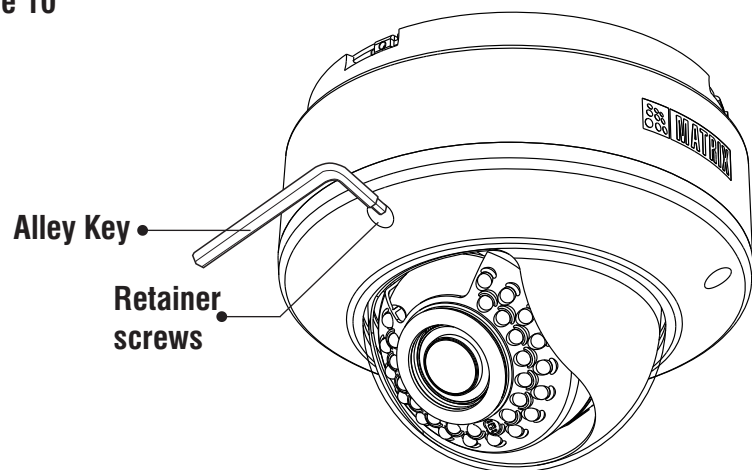


Adjusting Camera Angle

Step1: Opening Lens cover

- Use the Allen Key to loosen the Retainer screws on 3 sides of camera body.
- The retainer screws will still remain loosely connected.
- Open the lens casing body.
- Now you can adjust the camera angle.

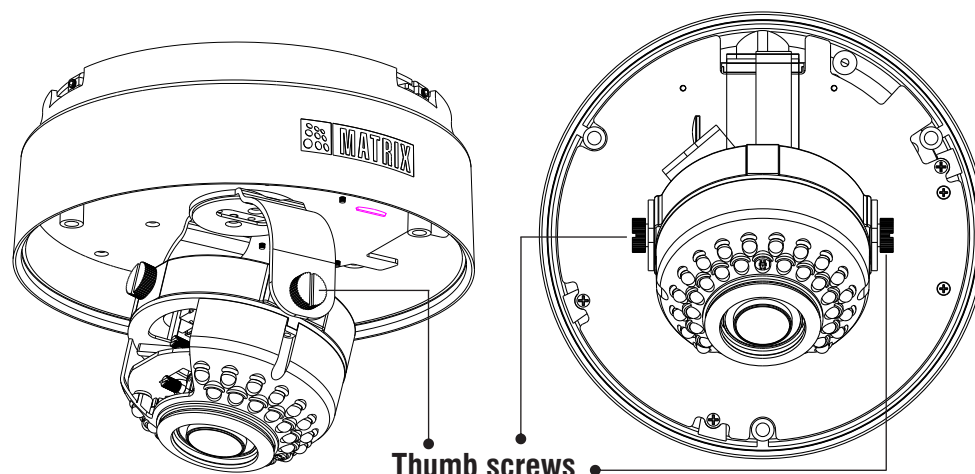
LED: CLASS1 (Category RS1)

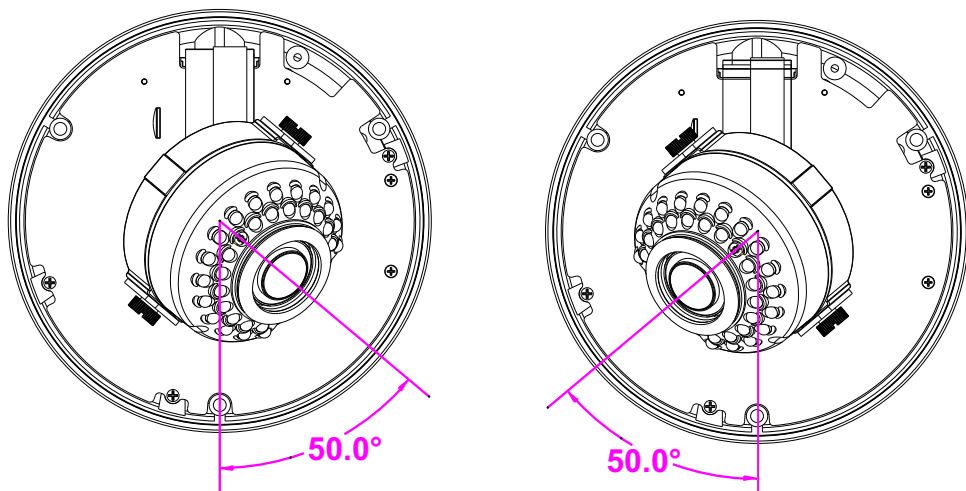

Step2: PAN, TILT movement

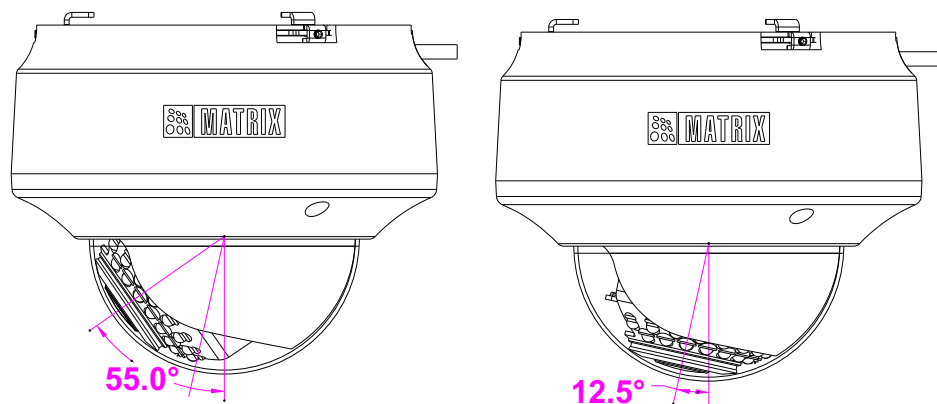
- Loosen thumb screws on both sides of lens for PAN movement, see **Figure 11**.
- For **PAN movement** you can move the camera to 100 degrees on one side, see **Figure 12**. To capture other side view, you have to open the camera body from the mounting ring, turn the body and mount to other side.

- For **Tilt movement** you can move the camera from 12.5 to maximum 55 degrees, see **Figure 13**.

- If the horizontal view is not aligned i.e. the view is tilted, then you can adjust the view by loosening the bottom thumb screw and adjusting the lens accordingly.

Powering the Camera

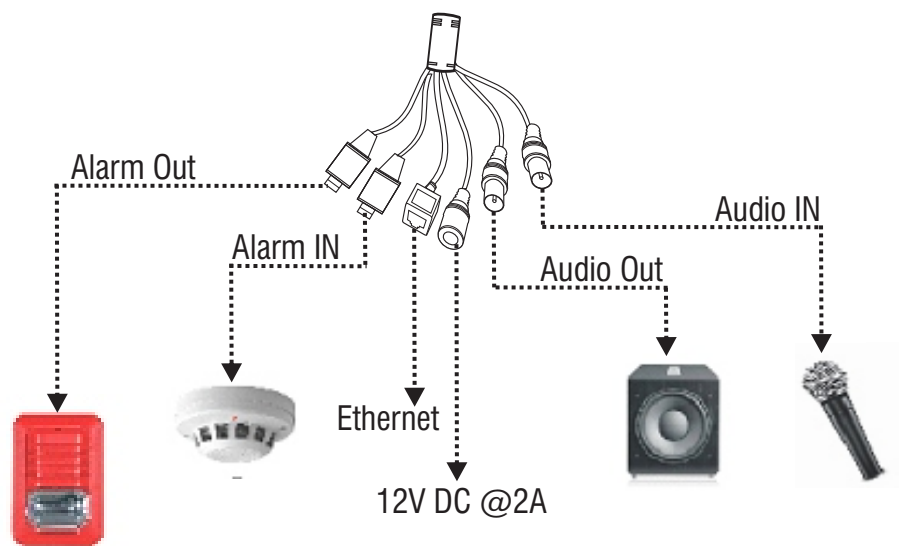
- Connect the **Ethernet** cable to LAN port and **Power** cable to the 12V DC power supply.

Power over Ethernet (PoE)

The IP camera is PoE- compliant, allowing transmission of power and data via a single Ethernet cable connected to PoE switch.

In Premium, Professional and Enterprise variants; connect Audio I/O and Alarm I/O cables if required.

1. You can connect the **Audio Input** device such as Mike to the Audio input cable of the camera. The audio when enabled will be recorded with the video and will be available at the monitoring location.
2. You may connect the **Audio Output** device such as earphone or speaker to the Audio Output cable of the camera. This will generate audio received from the network.
3. To detect alarm events you can connect a sensor device to the **Alarm IN** cable of the camera.
4. To get alerts on alarm you can connect the alarm sounding device such as hooter or siren to the **Alarm OUT** cable of the camera.



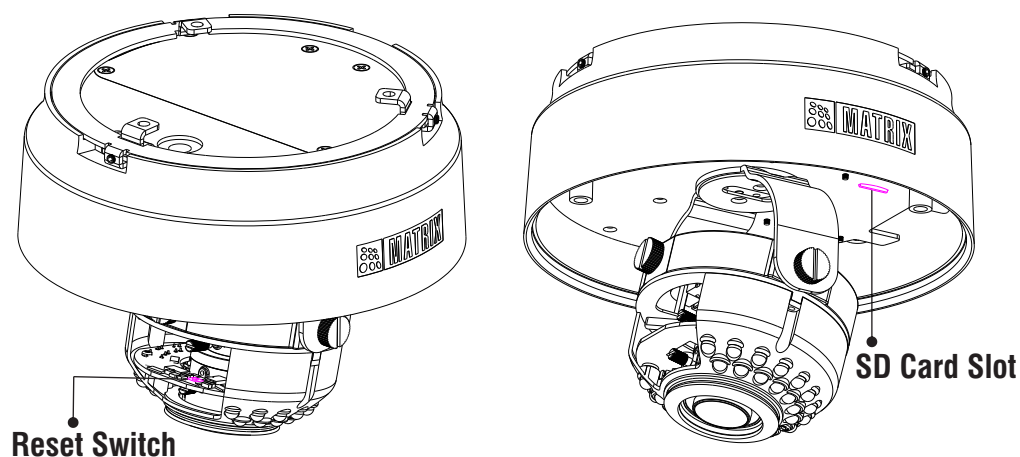
- 💡 If devices such as Mike and Speaker can be connected to Audio IN and Audio OUT, you may need to connect an external power source if their power requirements are not fulfilled with the camera adapter.
- 💡 If devices such as Sensor and small Buzzers can be connected to Alarm IN and Alarm OUT, you may need to connect an external power source if their power requirements are not fulfilled with the camera adapter.

Accessing Reset Switch and SD card slot

If you forget the IP address or login credentials of camera then the camera can be reset to factory default settings using the reset switch.

To access the Reset switch

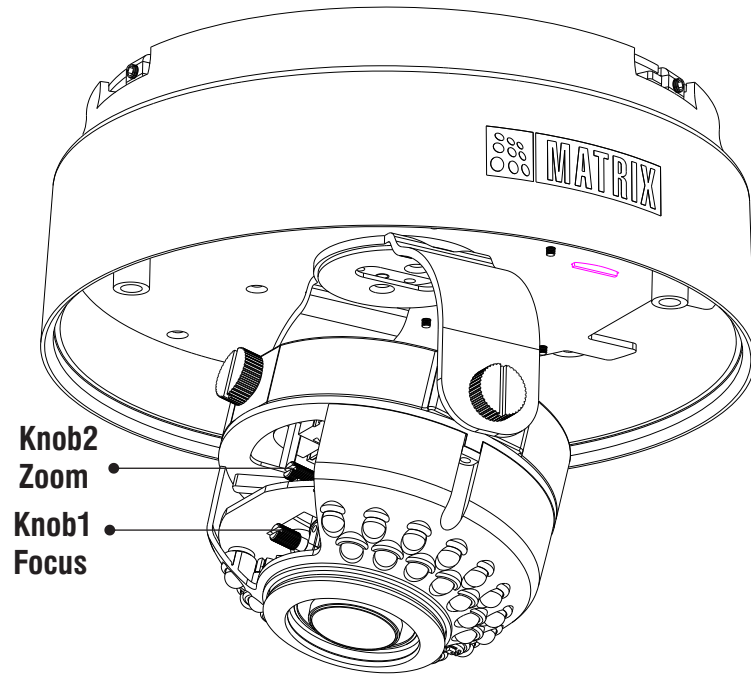
1. Open the retainer screws and remove the lens cover, see **Figure 10**.
2. The Reset switch is located near the lens, see **Figure 14**. Press the Reset switch for minimum 5 sec and release the switch to reset the camera to default settings.




3. You can insert the SD card in the slot to store your camera recordings, see **Figure 14**.

- ❗ After Reset or SD card insertion, you may need to set the camera focus and camera angle.


Adjusting Focus and Zoom in Varifocal Cameras



Knob 1: Focus

Towards F Far Focus ←  → Towards N Near Focus

Knob 2: Zoom

Towards W Zoom Out ←  → Towards T Zoom IN

Network Configuration

To view and configure the camera via LAN (Local Area Network), you need to connect the network camera in the same subnet with your PC. Then install the software to configure the IP address.

Steps to get the IP address:

- Once the camera is connected to the network, it will automatically be assigned a dynamic IP address by the DHCP server. You can view the assigned IP address through any IP scanner utility.
- If DHCP server is unavailable or is not able to provide an IP address then **192.168.1.126** will be set as default IP address.
- You can change the IP address and subnet mask of Camera from the Basic Settings page of camera.

Accessing via Web Browser

The IP cameras are supported by Microsoft Windows Operating System.

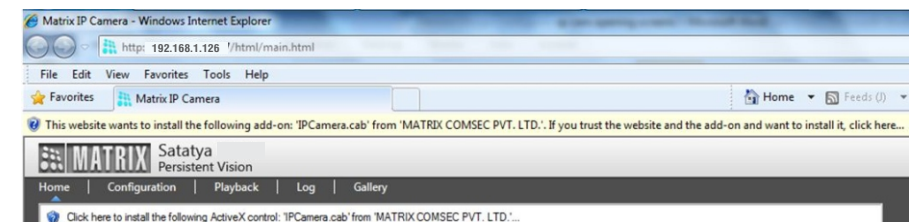
- ! In Internet Explorer you can access the camera with Matrix ActiveX plugin. In other browsers you need to install Quicktime or VLC plugin.

Steps:

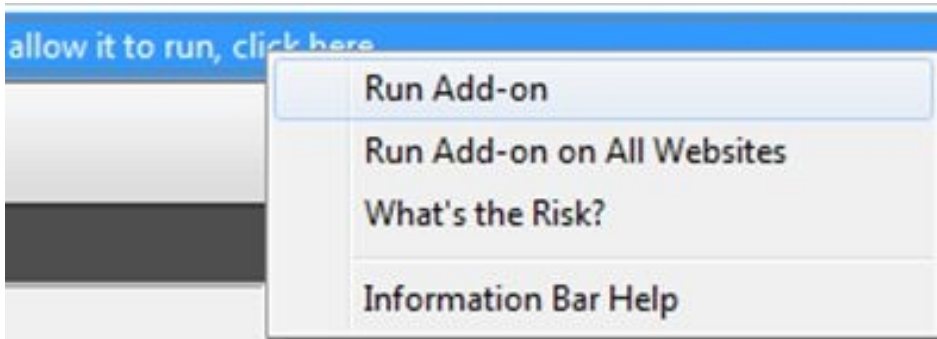
- Run the web browser as administrator.
- In the browser address bar, type the IP address of the camera e.g., 192.168.1.126 and press the Enter key to open the login interface.



- Enter the User Name and Password.
- By default, you can login with User Name as **admin**, **operator** or **viewer** with the password as **admin**, **operator** and **viewer** respectively.
- Click on Login.

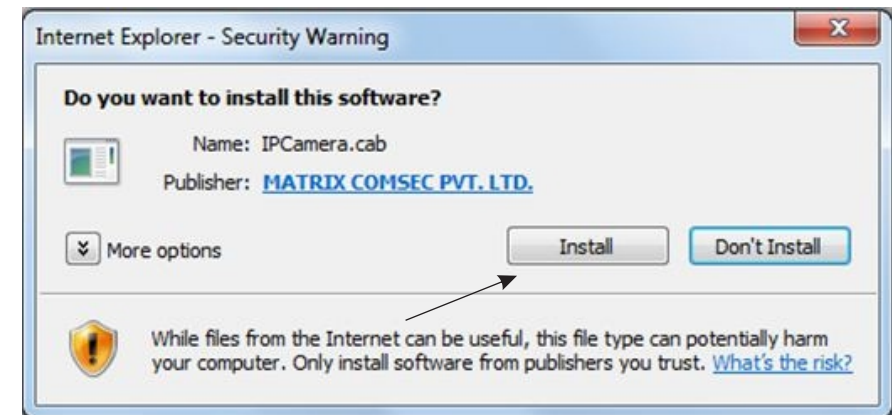
